

81.8 % vote in favour of strike mandates

Our president, Louise Chabot, unveiled the strike mandates at the General Negotiation Council on October 1st, 2015. 81.8 % of CSQ unions voted in favour of six one-day strike mandates, to be carried out on a rotating and national or regional basis, as part of the Common Front and depending on the progress of negotiations. This exceptionally strong mandate reflects the extraordinary mobilization at the CSQ!

As the results were unveiled, Louise Chabot was accompanied by the eight presidents of the public sector federations: Josée Scalabrini (FSE), Éric Pronovost (FPSS), Johanne Pomerleau (FPPE), Claire Montour (FSQ), Claude Demontigny (F4S), Anne Dionne (FPSES), Carol LaVack (FPPC), and Pierre Girouard (FEC).

In her opening speech, Louise Chabot acknowledged the “extraordinary mobilization demonstrated by members across Québec in recent months, through local, regional and national efforts.”

She also reiterated that our goal is to negotiate and obtain a satisfactory agreement, but that unfortunately the signals we are currently receiving leave us with no other recourse than to strike: “We cannot stand by with our arms crossed while the government maintains its obstinacy to destroy public services.”
